1. Find the integral of the function f(x,y) := 2y over the triangle with vertices at (1,2), (3,4), and (3,8). The simpler way to set up the integral is to express the bounds for y as a function of x:

$$\iint_D f(x,y) dA = \int_{x=1}^3 \int_{y=x+1}^{3x-1} 2y \, dy \, dx$$

$$= \int_{x=1}^3 (3x-1)^2 - (x+1)^2 \, dx$$

$$= \int_{x=1}^3 8x^2 - 8x \, dx$$

$$= \frac{8}{3}x^3 - 4x^2|_1^3$$

$$= 72 - \frac{8}{3} - 36 + 4$$

$$= 37\frac{1}{3}.$$
